Chanukah Potato Latkes Recipe

Serves 6

This is one of the most famous of Jewish foods and a specialty of Hanukkah. The latkes are served as an appetizer, as a side dish, and even for tea with a sprinkling of confectioners' sugar. They can be marvelous if properly prepared, just before eating.latkes

• 2 lbs (1 kg) potatoes • 2 large eggs • Salt • Oil for frying

Peel and finely grate the potatoes. Put them straight into cold water, then drain and squeeze them as dry as you can by pressing them with your hands in a colander. This is to remove the starchy liquid, which could make the latkes soggy.

Beat the eggs lightly with salt, add to the potatoes, and stir well. Film the bottom of a frying pan with oil and heat. Take serving-spoonfuls, or as much as 1/4 cup (50 ml), of the mixture and drop into the hot oil. Flatten a little, and lower the heat so that the fritters cook through evenly. When one side is brown, turn over and brown the other. Lift out and serve very hot.

VARIATION - You may add black pepper, chopped parsley, and finely chopped onion to the egg and potato mixture.

Adding 4 tablespoons of potato flour binds the fritters into firmer, more compact cakes, easier to handle but not quite as lovely to eat. - Claudia Roden is one of England's leading food writers. D'varim ~ from Rabbi Poticha

We have recently finished our Thanksgiving indulgences and are looking forward to Chanukah and our winter festivities. As members and supporters of the Jewish community we have much for which we are thankful living in America. Life, liberty, the pursuit of happiness and religious freedom are the umbrella themes we enjoy in the United States.

Historically, throughout the world, this was not our situation. During Chanukah we celebrate our triumph over severe decrees and near total assimilation. The challenges of the Ptolomies, the Seleucids and our own internal strife were difficult to overcome. But, we did. During our Festival of Lights we celebrate the military victory, the small vessel of oil which lasted eight days when the Maccabees were cleaning and rededicating the Temple in Jerusalem and bringing light into our lives during the darkest days of winter.

The strength and endurance of the Jewish people has endured throughout time regardless of internal or external pressures. Chanukah offers us the light we seek during winter, not merely from our chanukiot (menorahs) but the light from within - within our hearts and homes. Throughout time, we have maintained our identity even when as we learned from our encounters with other cultures. In addition, Reform Judaism has enabled us to introduce innovation while preserving our tradition. We embrace diversity while asserting that which is uniquely Jewish. It has been our embrace of modernity through the lens of Judaism, which has helped to sustain the Jewish people.

We are sustained by the miracle and victory of Chanukah. We look forward to our holiday of Tu B'Shevat, the holiday of the trees and the environment. And shortly thereafter we will celebrate Purim. In between our holidays we are sustained by our sacred teachings connecting us to Judaism and the world in which we live and enhance.

Lighting the Chanukah Menorah

During the eight days of Chanukah, we light the "chanukiah". The tallest candle (which is sometimes separated from the others) is called the: "shamus". Each night, the shamus is lit first. Using the shamus, light the other candles. On the first night, the shamus is lit then the first candle. Each night, you add one candle. By the eighth night all candles are lit. Candles are added to the chanukiah from right to left (like Hebrew writing) and are lit from left to right.

While holding the lit shamus candle, say/sing the blessings, then light the appropriate candle for the night (you light the newest candle first). Continue by singing Chanukah songs, celebrating the Festival of Lights. The first night, three blessings are said/sung – which includes the "shecheyanu."

The chanukiah should be placed at a window or a place of display. Remember: Place the chanukiah in a safe place since the candles burn until they go out on their own!

First Blessing: Baruch ata Adonai, Eloheinu melech ha-olam asher kideshanu be-mitzvotav, ve-tzivanu le-hadlik ner shel Hanukah. Blessed are you, Eternal our G-d, Ruler of the Universe, Who sanctified us through the commandments and has commanded us to kindle the light of Chanukah

Second Blessing: Baruch ata Adonai, Eloheinu melech ha-olam she-asa nisim la-avotenu by-yamim ha-hem ba-zeman ha-zeh. Blessed are you, Eternal our G-d Ruler of the Universe, Who performed miracles for our ancestors in day of old, at this season.

Third Blessing: First night only: Baruch ata Adonai, Eloheinu melech ha-olam she-hecheyanu, v'kiyemanu, v'higiyanu la-zeman ha-zeh. Blessed are you, Eternal our G-d, Ruler of the Universe, Who has given us life and preserved us, and enabled us to reach this season.

These lights are sacred; we are not to "use" them but only to behold them, so that their glow may rouse us to give thanks for the wondrous acts done for us by G-d.
